Woodland City Council Minutes Council Chambers 300 First Street Woodland, California

August 5, 1998

Mayor Melton Losoya opened a special meeting of the Woodland City Council in the Council Chambers at 7:05 p.m.

ROLL CALL:

COUNCIL MEMBERS PRESENT: Losoya, Borchard, Flory, Peart,

COUNCIL MEMBERS ABSENT: None

STAFF PRESENT: Marler, Siprelle, Winnop

PUBLIC COMMENT:

There were no public comments.

INTERIM CITY MANAGER POSITION:

The City Council discussed filling the position of Interim City Manager and utilizing a list of candidates supplied by the League of California Cities. Council Member Flory said the League charges \$100 for the list, and if the City Council picks a candidate from the list there is a \$400 charge. He said he looked forward to the Interim City Manager possibly serving as a facilitator for the Council to talk about goals and how to work together as a unit.

Council also discussed appoint Assistant City Manager Phillip Marler as Interim City Manager.

Leslie Marcus offered suggestions to fill the position of Interim City Manager as well as the City Manager position.

After further Council discussion the following action was taken:

On motion of Council Member Peart, seconded by Council Member Flory and carried by the following vote, the City Council appointed Assistant City Manager Phillip Marler as Acting City Manager, approved acting pay at 10 percent above the Assistant City Manager's current salary, and agreed the Assistant City Manager shall serve as Acting City Manager until an Interim City Manager is hired:

AYES: COUNCIL MEMBERS: Flory, Peart, Ryhal, Losoya

NOES: COUNCIL MEMBERS: Borchard

Council Member Borchard said he wanted the Assistant City Manager to be appointed as the Interim City Manager, and that was the reason for his "no" vote.

On motion of Council Member Flory, seconded by Council Member Peart and carried by unanimous vote, the City Council authorized the Mayor to send a letter to the League of California Cities requesting resumes from Interim City Manager candidates who have at least 10 years of City Manager experience in cities of 40,000 population or more, with background in personnel management, financing and land use planning.

Mayor Losoya requested staff to prepare a letter as soon as possible to the League of California Cities reflecting the Council's action.

On motion of Council Member Peart, seconded by Council Member Flory and carried by unanimous vote, the City Council agreed that as soon as the Council receives the resumes for Interim City Manager applicants from the League of California Cities the Council will call a special meeting to review the resumes and consider appointment of an Interim City Manager, and Council agreed to allow seven working days from the date the letter is sent to the League of California Cities to receive the resumes.
