APARTMENT RECYCLING



Do you have access to recycling at your apartment?

California state law AB 341 requires that all businesses that generate 4 or more cubic yards of waste each week and all multi-family communities with 5 or more units must have recycling service.

If you don't have recycling service at your apartment community, or if you have questions or concerns about the recycling program at your community, please contact your local recycling coordinator for assistance (see the back page of this calendar).

CONSTRUCTION AND DEMOLITION DEBRIS

Most construction and demolition (C&D) projects in California are required to divert 50% or more of their waste from the landfill. For details on the specific requirements in your community, please contact your local recycling coordinator for assistance (see the back page of this calendar). Mixed loads of C&D debris can be brought to the Yolo County Central Landfill C&D sorting facility for recycling--this may be the easiest way to satisfy the diversion requirements for your project.

- Carpet
- Roofing tiles
- Plastic foam
- Plastic film
- Pressure treated wood
- PVC pipe
- Concrete roofing tiles (accepted in source separated loads only)

Appliances and pressure treated wood may be dropped off separately for a fee.

BATTERIES

California has imposed a landfill ban on all batteries. Batteries cannot be thrown in the trash.

There are 44 convenient locations where Yolo County residents can bring household batteries for safe disposal. See the back pages of this calendar for locations. Lead-acid batteries from cars, trucks, boats, motorcycles, etc. can be recycled at the Yolo County Central Landfill every day for free.

ELECTRONIC WASTE

It is illegal to put TVs, computer monitors, laptops and other electronics in the trash. They contain toxic materials and must be recycled properly to avoid environmental contamination.



FOOD SCRAPS

In October 2014, the governor signed the Mandatory Commercial Organics Recycling Law (AB 1826), requiring businesses to recycle their organics wastes (food scraps and yard wastes).

The law requires that:

- Businesses that generate 8 cubic yards of organic waste per week shall arrange for organic waste recycling services by April 1, 2016.
- Businesses that generate 4 cubic yards of organic waste per week shall arrange for organic waste recycling services by January 1, 2017.
- Businesses that generate 4 cubic yards or more of commercial solid waste per week shall arrange for organic waste recycling services by January 1, 2019.



GLASS

Not all glass is created equal. Below is a list of what types of glass are redeemable, recyclable, and which types should be placed in the trash.

REDEEMABLE GLASS

When you buy certain beverages, you pay a California Redemption Value (CRV) deposit. Look for “CA CRV” or “CA CASH REFUND” on the container. Recycle these glass containers at a local redemption center and you’ll get your money back. They may also be recycled in your regular recycling cart for free. See the back pages of this calendar for CRV redemption centers in Yolo County.



RECYCLABLE GLASS

Non-CRV glass containers, such as food jars, sauce bottles, baby food containers, wine bottles, and other glass containers can be recycled in your recycling cart. These are not redeemable for cash because a CRV deposit was not charged when the items were purchased.



NON-RECYCLABLE GLASS

Drinking glasses, glass dishes, glass baking pans, windows, picture frame glass and other forms of glass are not recyclable and must be placed in the trash or donated to a reuse store.



Mandatory Organics Recycling: If you think that your business may be required to recycle organics, contact your local recycling coordinator (see the contacts on the back of this calendar) to learn about programs available to your business.



Yolo County residents can bring their household hazardous waste (HHW) to the Yolo County Central Landfill for free disposal every Friday & Saturday from 7:30 a.m. - 3:30 p.m. (15 gal. or 120 lbs. limit).





Reality: New-car manufacturers require that an API-certified oil be used to keep a warranty intact. As long as you use API-certified oil, it does not matter if it is re-refined or virgin. Since re-refined oils earn API certification, the warranty will not be voided.

LIGHTBULBS



INCANDESCENT BULBS

When they are burned out or broken, place in the trash. There are no recycling options for these bulbs.

NEON BULBS

These can be considered hazardous waste and should not be thrown in the trash. Bring old neon bulbs and signs to the landfill on a Friday or Saturday during Household Hazardous Waste Drop-off.

HALOGEN BULBS

When they are burned out or broken, place in the trash. There are no recycling options for these bulbs.



FLUORESCENT BULBS & TUBES

These bulbs contain mercury and are illegal to throw in the trash. See the back pages of the calendar for locations that accept these for free.

LED BULBS

These high efficiency bulbs do not contain any hazardous materials. When they are burned out or broken, place in the trash. There are no recycling options for these bulbs.

CHRISTMAS LIGHTS

Strings of Christmas lights can be recycled with electronics. See the back pages of this calendar for locations that accept electronics for free recycling.

Did you know?

By law, you can bring up to 50 aluminum, 50 glass, and 50 plastic California Redemption Value (CRV) containers in a single visit and request to be paid by count instead of by weight. You will be paid the full CRV redemption of 5 cents or 10 cents on each container. Inform the site attendant how you would like to receive payment before you hand over your load. Memorial Day

MATTRESSES

California's Used Mattress Recovery and Recycling Act requires mattress manufacturers to create a statewide recycling program for mattresses discarded in the state. The Program is funded through a recycling fee collected from consumers when a mattress or box spring is sold.

The Yolo County Central Landfill accepts household mattresses and box springs FREE of charge 7 DAYS A WEEK.

BULKY WASTE COLLECTION EVENTS

Free bulky waste drop-offs and/or curbside collection events are available to Yolo County residents during certain times of the year. Contact your local recycling program (see back page of calendar) for dates, locations and items accepted.

NEEDLES AND OTHER SHARPS



Used syringes, hypodermic needles, pen needles, intravenous needles, lancets, etc. (a.k.a. "sharps") are illegal to place in the trash. The following are some options available for disposing of sharps waste:

MAIL-BACK SERVICE

A list of sharps waste mail-back services authorized for use in California is available from the California Department of Public Health (CDPH).

HOSPITAL TAKE BACK

Some hospitals take back used sharps from patients who go to the hospital for regular outpatient services.

YOLO COUNTY HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE (HHW) DROP-OFF DAYS

During HHW drop-off days, home generated sharps are accepted for free and safe disposal. Before bringing your sharps for disposal, place them in a puncture-proof container, tape the lid closed and write "Sharps" on the outside of the container.


ORGANICS

Yolo County and the surrounding communities are committed to keeping organic waste out of the landfill.

What are organics?

Yard materials: Most communities in Yolo County have access to yard material collection. Contact your local recycling program (see back of calendar) for information on how to recycle your yard materials.

Got food scraps? Try composting! Composting is nature's way of recycling plant materials into a nutrient-rich soil supplement. Composting can require very little work and be odor and rodent free with proper techniques. For more information about composting, visit DavisRecycling.org.



PAINT

Latex and oil-based house paint, stains and varnish can be recycled everyday at these locations for free. Always call ahead for hours and to make sure the location can accept your amount of paint.

CESQG

(Conditionally Exempt Small Quantity Generator)

What is CESQG?



Businesses that generate a small amount of hazardous waste can utilize the CESQG program at the Yolo County Central Landfill to properly dispose of their hazardous waste. For details, call 1-800-207-8222 or click on the landfill tab at YoloCounty.org.

Rx

What should you do with expired and unused prescriptions and medications (a.k.a. pharmaceuticals)? Flushing pharmaceuticals down the toilet or throwing them in the trash can end up polluting the environment and exposing humans, plants and animals to harmful chemicals and hormones.

By Federal law, all controlled substances (such as vicodin, morphine, codeine, etc.) can only be handled by law enforcement. If you have any of these medications, you can bring them to a police station for disposal. Other pharmaceuticals can be brought to the below locations for free and safe disposal:

Scrap metal is recyclable! Scrap metal includes metal items such as plumbing pipe, file cabinets, screen doors, chairs, desks, metal miniblinds, window frames, car parts, metal light fixtures (remove the ballasts and tubes), bike frames, garbage cans, patio furniture and more!

AUTO, TRUCK, TRACTOR & MOTORCYCLE TIRES

Bring these tires (with or without rims) to the Yolo County Central Landfill for recycling. Fees apply. Limit 9 without a permit. Call the landfill for details, (530) 666-8856. The Yolo County Central Landfill is open Sunday from 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. & Monday – Saturday from 6:30 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.

SMALL TIRES

Bicycle, wheel barrow, go-cart and other small tires without rims can be recycled for free at the Yolo County Central Landfill. Fees apply for recycling 10 or more small tires.

TIRE RIMS

Tire rims can be recycled with scrap metal. See scrap metal recycling locations below.



WOOD

PCP treated wood, pressure treated wood and railroad ties contain hazardous chemicals and cannot be disposed of with regular trash. The Yolo County landfill accepts treated wood for special disposal; small lengths of 5 foot or less are preferred. Large quantities are accepted, however restrictions apply to commercial sized materials.

FIRE EXTINGUISHERS



Fire extinguishers should not be thrown in the trash.

You can either have your fire extinguishers refilled, or you can bring them to the free household hazardous waste drop-off at the Yolo County Central Landfill every Friday and Saturday from 7:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. for free and safe disposal.

Older fire extinguishers containing carbon tetrachloride are hazardous to human health and the environment. Carbon tetrachloride is very toxic, and when used on a fire also results in a toxic gas.

The contents of today's common fire extinguishers are not hazardous. However, they are still a cylinder under pressure which is a disposal hazard because they have the potential to explode and cause serious injuries to sanitation workers, damage waste hauling vehicles, or waste processing facilities. Even if they are empty, fire extinguishers can still be considered hazardous waste.






