

Argument in Favor Of Measure J

YES ON MEASURE J

A YES vote will reauthorize an existing ¼ cent sales tax to fund vital Library programs, enhance literacy, expand recreational programs for our youth, enhance public safety and crime prevention and assist low income residents with City utility bill payments.

A YES vote on J will NOT result in any increase in taxes.

Sunset: This authorization will expire in 8 years.

Accountability: We will receive a detailed spending plan and an annual report from the City of revenues collected and how the funds have been spent.

Fairness: The ¼ cent sales tax is already being collected; this measure extends the sunset date. 100% of this ¼ cent sales tax extension will remain in Woodland to serve our residents.

Woodlanders have a proud history of paying our own way and a willingness to pay for what we need. A YES vote on this measure means that approximately \$1.5 million to \$2 million annually will be raised for the next 8 years to help fund these critical City services. A YES vote means that we are taking an active role in protecting our quality of life in Woodland as we work to move our community forward.
