

Argument In Favor of Measure K

Yes on Measure K

A yes vote on Measure K is a yes vote for our Youth. Measure K will provide additional recreation programs for teen age and young children, assist with the re-opening of Hiddleston Pool and reduce existing recreation program fees and facility use fees to Woodland residents.

During recent years, necessary budget reductions have drastically reduced the City's ability to provide Park and Recreation programs for the youth of Woodland. This has been evidenced by the closing of Hiddleston Pool, reductions in Summer Park programs, the closing of the teen center at the Community Center, and the elimination of a multitude of after school activities. In addition, the Parks and Recreation staff was reduced down to just 4 employees, a 60% reduction in staff, which was the largest layoff among all City departments.

A Yes vote on Measure K will reverse these trends and reestablish Woodland's tradition of providing an impactful level of healthy recreation opportunities for children from the elementary ages through high school. When our children are involved in healthy physical activities that are supervised by positive role models, they are more likely to make better life-long decisions, become future positive role models themselves and strong community contributors.
