

CITY ATTORNEY'S IMPARTIAL ANALYSIS OF MEASURE K

Measure K is an advisory measure concerning the expenditure of City of Woodland sales tax revenues in the event that Measure J is approved by a majority of the voters voting on the measure.

Measure K does not increase taxes. Rather, Measure K asks voters within the City of Woodland whether the City should direct 60% of the sales tax revenues, if Measure J is approved, to expand and enhance youth and teen programs and facilities, including funding to support the re-opening of Hiddleson Pool, and to reduce fees charged for youth programs and use of city recreation facilities. If a majority of the voters approve this measure, it will be an indication to the City Council of how voters want the revenues to be spent. Although the City Council is not obligated to spend the revenues generated by any extended sales tax according to the advisory vote, the City Council may choose to do so.
