### **Report in Brief**

On November 21, 2008 the City of Woodland was awarded the 2008 Governor's Historic Preservation Award in recognition of the Explore Historic Woodland Guidebook. The Guidebook was one of ten projects recognized by Milford Wayne Donaldson, FAIA, State Historic Preservation Officer and the State Office of Historic Preservation at the Leland Stanford Mansion State Historic Park in Sacramento.

The Governor's Historic Preservation Awards are presented annually to organizations or public agencies whose contributions demonstrate notable achievements in preserving the heritage of California. Established in 1986, the Governor's Historic Preservation Awards Program aims to recognize meaningful achievements in historic preservation and to increase public awareness, appreciation, and support for historic preservation throughout the state.
