SUBJECT: 2009 Road Rehabilitation, CR102 (ARRA), Project No. 07-45;
Contract Award Notification

Report in Brief

Plans and Specifications and bid advertisement for the 2009 Road Rehabilitation, CR102 (ARRA), Project No. 07-45; were approved by Council at the March 17, 2009 meeting and advertisement began June 24th. Council authorized the City Manager to award the contract to the lowest responsive and responsible bidder on June 21st. Bids were opened on August 6th. A total of five (5) bids were received, the bids ranged from \$597,347.03 to \$817,242.33. The City Manager awarded the construction contract to Tiechert Construction in the amount of \$ 597,347.03 on September 8, 2009.

There is no Council action required for this item. The item is informational only.

Background

The American Reinvestment and Recovery Act (ARRA) was signed by President Obama on February 17, 2009. Approximately \$72 million in road funding is being distributed within the Sacramento Area Council of Government (SACOG) area. The funding is being distributed through pre-established mechanisms used to distribute annual funding. The City of Woodland's allocation is programmed for \$655,725. This amount was approved by the SACOG board on February 19, 2009.

The project will rehabilitate the pavement on County Road 102 between Hanson Way and E. Beamer Street. The bid additive alternate will rehabilitate the pavement between E. Main Street and Hanson Way.

Staff submitted the required preliminary engineering and environmental clearance paperwork to Caltrans on February 10, 2009. Authorization to proceed was received from Caltrans on June 8, 2009. The project award was delayed by a few weeks because of federal funding processing with Caltrans and road closure coordination impacts.

Discussion

The ranking for award is based on the Base Bid and Additive Alternate A. The bids are summarized below:

Construction is scheduled to begin September 21st, with a full closure of CR102 from October 5 to October 16. Arrangements have been made with the Farm Bureau for farmers to move their equipment thru the Target facility and with Adams Grain to access their facility from Main Street. Through traffic will be detoured to Beamer Street, Pioneer Avenue and Main Street.

Fiscal Impact

The project is fully funded by the American Reinvestment and Recovery Act (ARRA) and Measure E funds. This project's funding was approved in the Capital Budget adopted by Council on June 16, 2009. The approved budget is \$750,530 consisting of \$655,725 of ARRA funds and \$94,805 of Measure E funding. There is no impact to the General Fund.
