The Woodland City Council met in adjourned regular session at 7:00 p.m.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE:

Mayor Sandy invited everyone present to join him in the pledge of allegiance to the Flag of the United States of America.

ROLL CALL:

COUNCIL MEMBERS PRESENT: Sandy, Borchard, Flory, Rominger, Slaven

COUNCIL MEMBERS ABSENT: None

STAFF PRESENT: Kristensen, Ruggiero, Wegener, Siprelle, Vicars, James

PUBLIC COMMENT:

Tom Stallard, Chair of the Board of Supervisors, congratulated newly elected Council Members Melton Losoya and Dan Ryhal and reelected Council Member David Flory. He also thanked retiring Mayor Gary Sandy and retiring Council Member Jack Slaven. He then presented a resolution of appreciation to Council Member Slaven and said he would be presenting a similar resolution to Mayor Sandy at a later date.

Rick Gonzales congratulated Melton Losoya for receiving the highest number of votes in the March 26, 1996 election and becoming Woodland's first hispanic Vice Mayor (to become Mayor in 1998).

REPORTS OF CITY MANAGER:

CONSENT CALENDAR:

Vice Mayor Rominger requested that the February 20, 1996 minutes be removed from the Consent Calendar.

On motion of Council Member Rominger, seconded by Council Member Flory and carried by unanimous vote, the City Council approved the following Consent Calendar items:

RESOLUTION NO. 3950 - RESULTS OF MARCH 26, 1996 ELECTION:

The City Council adopted Resolution No. 3950 declaring the results of the General Municipal Election held in the City of Woodland on March 26, 1996. Melton Losoya, David Flory and Daniel Ryhal, having received the highest

number of votes for three vacancies on the Council, were elected Council Members (David Flory was reelected for a third term).

RESOLUTION NO. 3951 - APPRECIATION FOR COUNCIL MEMBER SLAVEN:

The City Council adopted Resolution No. 3951, a resolution of appreciation honoring retiring Council Member Jack Slaven.

RESOLUTION NO. 3952 - APPRECIATION FOR MAYOR SANDY:

The City Council adopted Resolution No. 3952, a resolution of appreciation honoring retiring Mayor Gary Sandy.

MINUTES:

Vice Mayor Rominger requested a correction to the February 20, 1996 minutes on page 13 to add that she had been in contact with the Yolo County Flood Control and Water Conservation District through the Water Resources Association, and the District is also interested in assisting in some sort of remedy regarding run-off from ag land.

On motion of Council Member Rominger, seconded by Council Member Borchard and carried by unanimous vote, the City Council approved the minutes of the regular Council meeting of February 20, 1996, as corrected.

PRESENTATIONS TO RETIRING COUNCIL MEMBER SLAVEN AND MAYOR SANDY:

Council Member Slaven commented on his term on the Council and thanked City staff and fellow Council Members.

Mayor Sandy presented a plaque and a framed Resolution of Appreciation to Council Member Slaven. He then commented on his term on the Council and thanked fellow Council Members and staff.

Vice Mayor Rominger presented a plaque with a gavel and a framed Resolution of Appreciation to Mayor Sandy.

OATH OF OFFICE - COUNCIL MEMBERS ELECT LOSOYA AND RYHAL:

The City Clerk advised that newly re-elected Council Member David Flory was given the oath of office on Monday, April 8, 1996, by his brother County Assessor Alan Flory who was deputized as Deputy City Clerk.

The City Clerk then administered the oath of office to new Council Members elect Melton Losoya and Daniel Ryhal. (The newly reorganized City Council now was comprised of Council Members Steve Borchard, David Flory, Melton Losoya, Elaine Rominger, and Daniel Ryhal.)

ELECTION OF MAYOR:

The City Clerk conducted the election of the Mayor.

On motion of Council Member Borchard, seconded by Council Member Losoya and carried by unanimous vote, the City Council appointed Elaine Rominger as Mayor.

PRESENTATION OF GAVEL:

City Clerk Jean Winnop presented the gavel to Mayor Rominger.

ELECTION OF VICE MAYOR:

Mayor Rominger conducted the election of the Vice-Mayor.

On motion of Council Member Flory, seconded by Council Member Borchard and carried by unanimous vote, the City Council appointed Melton Losoya as Vice Mayor.

REMARKS FROM COUNCIL MEMBERS:

Newly elected Council Members Losoya, Ryhal and Flory gave thanks to family and friends who helped with their respective campaigns and talked about their hopes for serving on the Council for the next four years.

ADJOURNMENT:

At 8:08 p.m. there being no further business the meeting was adjourned to April 16, 1996, at 7:00 p.m. Mayor Rominger invited everyone present to have cake and punch which was to be served in the first floor lobby of City Hall.
