Vice Mayor Timothy called the Woodland City Council adjourned meeting to order at 7:05 p.m.

PUBLIC COMMENT:

No members of the audience requested to speak upon announcement of the public comment portion of the meeting by Vice-Mayor Timothy.

HEARING - GIBSON ROAD SAFETY AND OPERATIONAL STUDY:

Director of Public Works Ron Tribbett presented the Gibson Road Safety and Operational Study which provided seven options improving traffic safety to Gibson Road between Cottonwood Street and East Street. Five were dropped as they did not accomplish the goal of providing overall traffic safety improvement to Gibson Road. The remaining two alternatives were discussed with the comments taken from participants at the meeting. Option 1 provides four lanes and Option 2 provides 2 lanes of traffic.

The public hearing was opened.

There being no further comments Vice Mayor Timothy closed the hearing to public comment.

Council discussed the basis of their findings on the two alternatives.

On motion of Council Member Crescione, seconded by Council Member Flory and carried by the following vote, the City Council approved and authorized staff to proceed with Option 2 as stated in the Gibson Road Safety and Operational Study which will reduce Gibson Road to two lanes (one in each direction) with a continuous left turn lane and removal of some on-street parking (Gibson Road would remain four lanes east of Sixth Street with the two travel lane configuration):

FINAL MAP OF SOUTHWOOD UNIT NO. 2 (SUBDIVISION NO. 3928):

On motion of Mayor Holman, seconded by Council Member Sandy and carried by unanimous vote, the City Council approved the final map for Southwood Unit No. 2, Subdivision No. 3928.

COMMUNITY SWIM CENTER:

Parks and Recreation Director John Suhr made a presentation on the need of an auxiliary facility for the Swim Center.

DIAMOND LUMBER SITE:

Use of the Diamond Lumber site, 1122 Main Street, for a temporary facility for Parks and Recreation Department staff was presented. A phased development plan is to be developed by staff for presentation to Council.
