and your deposit will be refunded



Why Is There a C&D Ordinance?

Woodland's Construction and Demolition Debris Recycling and Diversion (C&D) Ordinance became effective Sept 18, 2006. This ordinance was established to help the city comply with AB 939 (signed into California state law in 1989), which requires local governments to divert 50% of waste from landfill disposal by the year 2000, and each successive year thereafter. The state may issue monetary fines up to \$10,000 per day for non-compliance.



Which Projects Are Subject To The C&D Ordinance?

1. All construction projects located in the Spring Lake Planning Area.
2. Demolition projects equal to or greater than 1,000 square feet.
3. Construction of a new commercial, industrial, or institutional building or structure that is equal to or greater than 1,000 square feet.
4. Construction of new residential dwellings in a subdivision where a homebuilder has a construction phase that includes multiple

residential lots (three or more) under construction at a given time.

5. Construction of new multifamily dwellings where four or more units are under construction at a given time.
6. Addition or alteration of a commercial, industrial, institutional, or multifamily building or structure that is equal to or greater than 1,000 square feet.

How Do I Comply?

Submit a Waste Reduction & Recycling (WRR) Plan

~Source Separation or Mixed Recovery

Plan to either separate different waste materials into distinct containers for hauling or combine materials into one container for sorting at a C&D sorting facility.

~Waste Management's Franchise Waste Agreement

The agreement states that unless you plan to self-haul your trash, then you must contract with the City's franchise waste hauler, Waste Management, for trash removal.

As of January 17th 2012, Waste Management is the exclusive recyclables hauler for Woodland. Self-haulers are excluded.



Sub-Contractors & Employees

~**Educate your Sub-contractors and Employees** because the person who signs and submits the WRR Plan is ultimately responsible for adhering to the ordinance. It is a good idea to have the lead contractor fill out and sign the WRR Plan.

~**Junk Haulers** whose sole purpose is to haul waste are illegal in the City of Woodland due to the franchise waste agreement with Waste Management.

Reporting your Diversion

~**At the end of the project** you need to complete, sign, and submit the WRR Report form to the C&D Recycling Program Coordinator to receive a final approval and receive a refund of your deposit.

~**Weight Receipts must** be provided for any materials listed on a WRR Report. Materials listed without a weight receipt will not be counted towards diversion. Rough estimates are not acceptable.

What Are My Costs?

\$275 - A non-refundable Administrative Fee is included in the building fees to cover the costs associated with administering the C&D Recycling Program.

\$1000 - A refundable Recycling Deposit is submitted by the applicant along with the Waste Reduction and Recycling Plan and is refunded only after program compliance is complete. If compliance with the C&D Recycling Program is not met, the deposit is forfeited to the City's Solid Waste Fund.
