



Day 1, Sunday, September 27




Depart at 7:30am from Target in Woodland and begin your adventure to Canyon Country. Coffee and breakfast snack will be served on the coach. Stop in Reno for lunch on your own and perhaps put a lucky quarter in your favorite slot machine. Travel through the High Desert to the quaint town of Tonopagh, nicknamed the Queen of the Silver Camps. Visit the Tonopagh Mining Park located the site of the original mining claims that started the Silver Rush to Tonopagh. Learn the history as you see the exhibits at the Visitors Center. Walk around the historic buildings and imagine what life was like in the early 1900's. Check into the Best Western Hi-Desert Inn for your overnight accommodations. (CB)

Day 2, Monday, September 28



After an included breakfast, depart from the Silver Town for the glittery lights of Las Vegas. The glitter and glamour of the Las Vegas Strip awaits you today. Probably the most famous stretch of road in the world, this town is four miles of neon-lit resorts with around-the-clock action that is like nowhere else on earth. Arrive midday and enjoy an included lunch at the 4-star Brio Restaurant. Take a riding tour of Las Vegas... learning the history and viewing some of the new casinos. Check into Harrah's Resort and Casino, located on the Strip. Enjoy the evening as you choose... perhaps visit Mandalay Bay's Shark Reef aquarium or stop by the Luxor to see the sphinxes and pyramid or New York-New York brings the "Big Apple" to life right on the Vegas strip. See the Eiffel Tower, "ooh" and "ahh" at the Mirage volcano or the dancing fountains of the Bellagio are just across the street from your hotel. (B, L)

Day 3, Tuesday, September 29



This morning, depart from Las Vegas. Your destination for the day is the red and white sandstone cliffs of Zion National Park. In sheer magnitude and color, Zion is very likely one of the most awe-inspiring national parks in the world. Designated in 1919, Zion is Utah's oldest national park. The park is known for its incredible canyons and spectacular views. Lunch is included at the historic Zion Lodge. After lunch, climb aboard Zion's open-air tram to experience spectacular scenery as you wind alongside the Virgin River through the 2,400 foot deep, one-half mile wide Zion Canyon. The native sandstone creates unbelievable ribbons of color as the mountainside rises to the sky. Check into the Hampton Inn in Springdale for the overnight. The town of Springdale is located at the boundary of Zion National Park. It has earned the title of one of the prettiest towns in Utah and is a delight of shops and restaurants for the tourist. Enjoy the evening! (L)

Day 4, Wednesday, September 30

Breakfast is included at the hotel. Leaving from Springdale, depart Zion Canyon and climb over 2,000 ft up the east canyon and through the Zion Canyon Tunnel. As we travel to the east entrance of the park, we will experience the beautiful red and white rock layers, Ponderosa Pine trees, and slot canyons. Construction of the 1.1 mile Zion-Mount Carmel Tunnel began in the late 1920's and was completed in 1930. At the time it was the longest tunnel of its type in the United States. The purpose of the building the Zion-Mount Carmel Tunnel was to create direct access to Bryce Canyon and Grand Canyon from Zion National Park. Travel on to Bryce Canyon National Park, truly one of the most spectacular scenic wonders of the world. The formations within the park, called Hoodoos, are the creation of wind and water erosion over eons of time. Today, travel to Bryce Canyon National Park, truly one of the most spectacular scenic wonders of the world. Iron oxidizing within the rock has caused the natural orange and red hues that color these formations. Stop for lunch on your own at Ruby's Inn just outside the park which will also be your overnight accommodation. After lunch, meet a step on guide for a narrated tour into Bryce National Park. The scenic overlooks provide incredible scenery so be sure to bring your camera. Seats are reserved his evening a Western dinner with Western entertainment at Ruby's Inn. (B, D)



Day 5, Thursday, October 1,

Depart from Bryce after an included breakfast for the North Rim of the Grand Canyon. Here at the North Rim, you can best experience the canyon's colors, shadows and formations in quiet reflection and repose. It's true that the majority of Grand Canyon visitors miss the spectacular North Rim and miss the canyon's lure of rugged solitude. Here you find the perfect balance of marvel and creature comforts.

The restaurant doesn't just feature breathtaking views and great food, it has also been certified as a green restaurant since 2009. Feel free to enjoy your meal, take in the scenery, and rest easy knowing that everything is being done to preserve the Grand Canyon Lodge for generations to come. After an included lunch, depart for a return to the bright sights and sounds of Las Vegas, Check into Harrah's for your second overnight. Now that you can choose other shows and casinos to visit you may not have had time to take in on the first night in Las Vegas. Enjoy a late show if you choose, your tour does not depart until midday tomorrow. (B, L)



Day 6, Friday, October 2

Sleep in this morning, depart midday from Las Vegas for Bakersfield. Check in for the night at the Four Points by Sheraton. Dinner is included at the Woolgrowers Basque Restaurant.. a favorite restaurant of
