Tringali reported that 83 seniors attended the THS Spaghetti Feed fundraiser with SCI donating the cost of the meal. This enabled THS to keep the total \$400 donated for their Santa Cruz trip. Yolo County Public Health Nurse Lisa Musser, RN will be hosting a series of Healthy Living Workshops at the Senior Center. These workshops aim to help people with chronic conditions adopt healthier behaviors, take charge of their



**BACKGROUND INFORMATION:** The following provides highlights of the Senior Center since the last report.

**Senior Volunteer Appreciation Dinner:** The annual Senior Volunteer Appreciation Dinner was held on Thursday August 6, 2015 to thank and honor those who volunteer at the Senior Center. Staff recognized four individual volunteers for their service and dedication to the Senior Center: Elizabeth Kemper (Senior Center Inc. Treasurer), Chuck Winter (Senior Center Inc. Secretary, Welcome Desk), Sandi Winter (Welcome Desk, Senior Gram mailing), and Gary Wright (Parkinson’s Support Group leader). Additionally, the Teens Helping Seniors program was also recognized as outstanding volunteers.

**Solar Power Coming Soon to the Community and Senior Center:** Construction of the City’s solar project in the south parking lot of the Community and Senior Center is scheduled to begin in early September. The solar arrays will provide 80% of the facility's energy needs, greatly lower energy costs, reduce greenhouse gas emissions to help reach the City’s Climate Action Plan goals, and provide shade structures over more than 100 parking spots. During construction, most of the south parking lot will be closed to the public; however, the first row of parking closest to the building will remain open for senior parking. This project is one of six solar projects the City will be constructing starting September 2015 to save money and help save the environment.

**Fraud Fair:** The City of Woodland Senior Center, in partnership with the Yolo County District Attorney’s Office and the Woodland Police Department, is hosting the 2015 Yolo County Senior Resource and Crime Prevention Fair on Wednesday, October 14<sup>th</sup> from 9:00 a.m.-12:00 p.m. at the Woodland Community and Senior Center. There is an opportunity to meet local law enforcement leaders, fraud experts, and scam-fighting experts to better prepare oneself to avoid fraud tactics.
