<i>Acronym/Word</i>	<i>Definition</i>
AB1600	Assembly Bill 1600: The Government Code section that rules development impact fee calculation and reporting. The MPFP document is prepared as a result of AB1600 requirements.
AB32	Assembly Bill 32: The Government Section Code that was enacted to require the California Air Resources Board to develop regulations and market mechanisms that will ultimately reduce California's greenhouse gas emissions by 25 percent by 2020.
ADA	American's with Disabilities Act: Federal civil rights legislation for disabled persons passed in 1990.
APS	Audible Pedestrian Signal: A device that communicates information about pedestrian timing in nonvisual format such as audible tones, verbal messages, and/or vibrating surfaces.
BCP	Business Continuity Plan
CCTV	Closed Caption TV
CDBG	Community Development Block Grant: A federal funding program for local community enhancement.
CEQA	California Environmental Quality Act: California Public Resources Code section 2100 et sec, applies to projects undertaken, funded or requiring an issuance of a permit by a public agency and requires development projects to submit documentation of their potential environmental impact (generally in the form of an EIR).

EIR	Environmental Impact Report: A detailed report required by CEQA that describes and analyzes the significant environmental effects of a proposed project, identifies alternatives and discusses ways to reduce or avoid possible environmental damage.
EIS	Enterprise Information System
EOC	Emergency Operations Center
FEMA	Federal Emergency Management Agency: Agency of the US government tasked with disaster mitigation, preparedness, response and recovery planning.
GIS	Geographic Information System: integrates hardware, software and data for capturing, managing, analyzing and displaying all forms of geographically referenced information.
I&I	Inflow and Infiltration: terms used to describe the ways that groundwater and storm water enter into dedicated wastewater or sanitary sewer systems.
LOS	Level of Service
MPFP	Major Projects Financing Plan: Document prepared in conformance with AB1600 to calculate development impact fees.
MPRA	Master Plan Remainder Area
MSC	Municipal Services Center

MSE	Measure E: 12 year extension of the ½ cent sales tax charged within the City limits. This measure was passed by voters in June 2006 and is used to fund roads, park rehab, Community Sr Center Phase II and Sports Park, City Hall Expansion, Library Expansion and Opera House Expansion.
NEPA	National Environmental Policy Act: establishes national environmental policy and goals for the protection, maintenance, and enhancement of the environment, and provides a process for implementing these goals within federal agencies.
NPDES	National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System: A permit program authorized by the Clean Water Act to control water pollution by regulating point sources that discharge pollutants into waters of the United States.
OPR	Office of Planning and Research: Office within the Governor's administration that legislative and policy research, assistance in land-use planning, and manages the Office of the Small Business Advocate.
PLC	Programmable Logic Controller: a digital computer used for automation of electromechanical processes.
Proposition 1B	Highway Safety, Traffic Reduction, Air Quality, and Port Security Bond Act of 2006. Proceeds of bonds deposited into the Local Streets and Road Improvement, Congestion Relief and Traffic Safety Account of 2006. Funds allocated directly to cities and counties for traffic congestion relief, traffic safety, transit, storm damage, maintenance, construction and other projects to improve the local street and road system.

Proposition 42	Transportation Congestion Improvement Act. Requires revenues resulting from state sales taxes on the sale of fuel to be used for public transit and mass transportation; city and county street and road repairs and improvements; and state highway improvements.
Proposition 50	Water Quality, Supply and Safe Drinking Water Projects. Bond measure passed in 2002 that allows the state to award competitive grants for, among others, water management and water quality improvement projects.
RCP	Reinforced Concrete Pipe
ROW	Right of Way
SACOG	Sacramento Area Council of Governments: Association of local governments in the six-county Sacramento Region that provides regional transportation planning and funding, and serves as a forum for the study and resolution of regional issues.
SCADA	Supervisory Control and Data Acquisition: System that collects data from various sensors at a remote location and sends the data to a central computer which manages and controls the data.
SD	Storm Drain
SDFMP	Storm Drain Facility Master Plan
SLSP	Spring Lake Specific Plan
SSMP	Sanitary Sewer Master Plan
SSO	Sanitary Sewer Overflow: Condition whereby untreated sewage is discharged into the environment, escaping wastewater treatment.

VOIP	Voice Over Internet Protocol: Technology that allows voice calls to be made using a broadband Internet connection instead of a regular (analog) phone line.
WDR	Waste Discharge Requirement: provides a consistent approach for reducing sanitary sewer overflows (SSOs).
WPCF	Water Pollution Control Facility (also referred to as the Wastewater Treatment Plant or WWTP).

WWTP	Wastewater Treatment Plant (also referred to as the WPCF or Water Pollution Control Facility).
YECA	Yolo Emergency Communications Agency
