September 21, 1991

The Woodland City Council met in adjourned regular session at 10:00 a.m. Vice Mayor Timothy opened and chaired the meeting.

ROLL CALL:

COUNCIL MEMBERS PRESENT: Holman, Crescione, Flory, Sandy, Timothy

COUNCIL MEMBERS ABSENT: None

STAFF PRESENT: Kristensen

PUBLIC COMMENT:

Vice Mayor Timothy asked for public comment on issues not on the agenda. No comments were received.

COUNTY REAPPORTIONMENT PLAN:

Council Member Sandy expressed his concern over the proposed reapportionment plan now before the County Board of Supervisors. The concern is that the proposal places the Southeast Area development and some 1,600 existing residents into a supervisorial district which is unlikely to be represented by someone from Woodland. He felt the City Council should advocate what the Council believes to be best for all Woodland interests.

Mayor Holman responded with his belief that the proposal was consistent with the goals previously outlined by the Council, provided some new benefits to Woodland and was the best available considering current political realities.

Council received a September 20, 1991 letter from Joe Falvey (attached) on the subject which was read to the audience.

Discussion ensued among the Council.

The Council heard comments on the topic from the following people in attendance: Fred Baillard, Fred Harvey, Mike Davis, Ernie Pfanner, Twyla Thompson, Bobby Harris, and Rich Harrison.

Following further discussion, the Council unanimously approved sending a letter signed by all Council members to the County Board of Supervisors which:

1. indicates Council's support for Map C, and
2. requests the Board modify Map C by moving the 1,600 Southeast Woodland voters from District 4 into District 3 unless this would result in adverse impacts to Woodland's representation elsewhere, and
3. suggests that the Board reexamine its policy of protecting incumbent supervisors' residences since the Council believes this was the driving force that divides Woodland into three supervisorial districts, and
4. indicates Council support for retention of the Conaway and Yolo Bypass areas in District 3 due to potential growth and water issues affecting Woodland, and
5. indicates Council support for retention of the County Road 29 and County Road 27 area south of Woodland in District 5 due to potential growth issues affecting Woodland.

The motion was made by Council Member Flory and seconded by Council Member Crescione.

It was also informally agreed that Mayor Holman and Council Member Sandy would jointly present the letter to the Board at its September 24, 1991 hearing on reapportionment on behalf of the entire Council.

ADJOURNMENT:

At 11:45 a.m. the meeting was adjourned to September 24, 1991, at 7:00 p.m.
