The Heidrick Ag History Center's Second Saturday Educational Series gives the public the opportunity to see antique agricultural machinery in action. As we continue to grow Second Saturday events, we will offer visitors a unique perspective on how agricultural processes have evolved over time in California.

Rice is a booming business in the Sacramento Valley. On February 9th step back in time and learn about the beginnings of rice cultivation. As part of the Second Saturday Educational Series, the Heidrick Ag History Center will demonstrate the early 1900s Monitor Rice Seperator. This antique machine separates debris from rice kernels, as it did in the fields of Yolo County over a century ago.

Learn about the art and science of engine customization. For machine enthusiasts and those interested in restoring antique engines or farm machinery, the Second Saturday Educational Series on March 9th offers the opportunity to learn about custom engine bearings. Learn how various metals, drilling methods and the pouring processes are used when making engine components.

Each month the Heidrick Ag History Center features a different and unique aspect of California agriculture and machinery.
